

#### **Parish Announcements**

#### Hello friends,

First for this weekend, an invitation. For just over a year now (starting with John Francis) there's been a **Bible Study running on Thursday mornings**. Shortly after the 8:00 Mass in Coon Valley, some five to ten folks from both parishes get together in Coon Valley or at the Daily Brew or in Viroqua to look at the readings for the coming weekend's Masses and reflect on them together. This is a very inviting and freeflowing group of folks who invest that time each week entering into the Lord's Word, and you are very welcome to check it out. If you are interested in hearing more (including where the Study is meeting on a given week), contact Bob Kerska at vscrek@mwt.net – he's your man to get in the loop.

Second, I think we are far enough into my tenure as your Pastor (thank you to everyone who has been congratulating me on two years here) to name an elephant who's been hanging out in that corner of the room over there – the big question **"how long are we gonna have this guy?"** It's a very fair question. Both Viroqua and Coon Valley have had a disproportionately high turnover of Pastors in recent memory, which crafts a narrative of transition and hesitation. If that tenuous thread fits in your personal Church tapestry, I do not blame you one bit. Whether you like a guy like me or not, it's hard to feel any kind of permanence or longevity or even to establish trust when you also carry a history of regular goodbyes and hellos.

So let me give you the official version: I am here on a sixyear assignment, starting July 5 2022, renewable one time. What things are going to look like when that renewal comes up in four years is a big question that's going to have to stay a big question for the next three years and eight months, but what I can say is that when I received this assignment from the Diocese, the Personnel Council (the chief advisors to the Bishop on priest placements and HR) made it clear to me that they were aware of the peculiar circumstances surrounding my assignment as well as that very history of high turnover. Of course, if the Bishop were to ask me to pack up and go up to Eau Claire or to La Crosse or to go study Canon Law (Heaven help us - I'd be horrible at that) my sense of obedience would have a very hard time saying no. But I'll also say that when I met with the Bishop a month ago and explained our histories he expressed his own concern for you. All that's to say that I am going to treat the next four years and the six years after that just the way I've treated the last two years: taking one day at a time with a presumption of perseverance and a constant labor for our parishes' trust, restoration, and growth. I can't/won't tell you how to feel about all this, but I certainly do invite you to simply offer your own trust to the Lord to be the true Good Shepherd watching over us, His flock.
