



### From the Pastor

Hello friends,

For the past few weeks here I've been aware of the looming "March 1-9" in my schedule - an approaching flurry of extra activity demanding a bit more time and energy and intention. These extra things are all powerful and beautiful moments – things like Ash Wednesday, the healing service in Cashton, and a retreat I'm giving (by the time you read this, "gave") up in Wausau on Saturday – all moments for me to listen to the Holy Spirit and to witness His movement in folks like you and those Wausau folks on the receiving end of it all. In the first place, allow me to apologize if you've been on the receiving end of needing more of my time than I could give over the last few weeks (or anywhere along the last few years). In the second place, thank you for sharing in all the moments that made up the last few weeks here – weekend and daily Masses, those extra events, coming through to use our little chapel,

The last few weeks are also maybe a good look at the way seasons like Lent and Advent sometimes go. They're seasons intended for both you and me to step back and breathe deeply with the Lord – to take on the physical and spiritual posture of receptivity and openness to His voice. One of my favorite passages from the Old Testament comes from 1 Kings 9: 9-18 – Elijah's cave. As it tends to

go with him, Elijah is being hunted down for doing what the Lord asked (he had a habit of causing problems for folks in power), and he takes refuge in a cave up in the mountains to listen for the Lord's voice. The way



the story plays out, the Lord tells Elijah to wait for his voice. A raging wind whips up against the mountain, strong enough to break boulders, but the Lord was not in the wind. Next an earthquake shakes the mountain to its roots, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. Next a fire sweeps across the mountain, but the Lord was not in the fire. Finally, after all this tumult, Elijah hears a quiet, gentle sound – this finally he recognizes as the Lord's voice.

At our snowy Ash Wednesday Masses I shared a peculiar phenomenon that unfailingly comes up in me on fasting days. Despite the fact that I'm usually not too terribly hungry until noon or one or so, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday morning never fail to wake me up with a compelling "my goodness I need a hamburger right now." There's a real spiritual component to this season — an invitation into the desert with Jesus, an invitation from the Holy Spirit to let this season be different, set apart, and a corresponding imposition from the very real and very annoying evil spirit to try and distract you from whatever the Holy Spirit is trying to do in you. It takes work to slow down into these seasons, to let this time be different, and that work is work worth doing.

#### LENT IS HERE!

◆ Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.



♦ In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

### DID YOU KNOW?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$100,000 a year from your IRA directly to a charity. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD. Consult your tax advisor before making any decisions. If a QCD is for you, please consider St. Mary's Parish as your charity of choice.
