

## From the Pastor

## Hello friends,

For the past few weeks my lungs have had a hearty coating of sawdust keeping various other contagions at bay (yes, I exercise dust management, but that really only goes so far). I've been sanding away at, chiseling, and shaping the original corpus (body) from St. Mary Viroqua's crucifix, a six-foot tall statue with (past tense) a bit of mouse damage and some of the mildew that comes with deeply aged wood. If you've been around Viroqua for the last few weeks (and the last few years of leadup), you may recall hearing that this last week we began our 2025 renovation, and my part in that is getting the restored crucifix ready to go.

For the sake of backtracking and letting you in on a thing that's important to your priest, when I was at Mundelein down in Chicago I took full advantage of the seminary woodshop. My old man is a tradesman by original profession, having supported our family as a general contractor when we were still out in California, carrying on the family business he had first inherited from his own father (who, coincidentally, spent a good bit of time building churches in the mid-1900's churchbuilding boom). From time to time my dad would bring us out to the jobsite, and maybe since then I've always had an appreciation for folks that have some grime under their fingernails. Anyhow, starting as a kid and during my time in that Mundelein shop I've found the process of woodworking to be remarkably cathartic, rejuvenating. Wood generally does exactly what you tell it to do, which puts the responsibility squarely on the woodworker to tell it to do the right thing. It moves, it breathes, even decades after it's cut down and processed. One wrong smack with a chisel can ruin days' worth of work, and even the work of repairing that kind of damage adds remarkable character and narrative to the end product.

It's been strange working on this old corpus. After practicing away at woodworking for a decade now, I get to apply those same strokes and cuts I've been learning on a fixture of this liturgical home. The strange part of all this is the hunching over Jesus' face and feet and kneecaps, feeling like I need to apologize to Him for trimming up the crown of thorns, drawing out that sprained ankle or beat-up nose. Just as strange was cutting off half His hand where the mice had done their most effective work, carving down a new block and shaping new fingers to reflect those hands that worked the same miracles we hear about in the Gospels. The fact that Jesus has a Face, that He looks at you and me face to face, His simple realism is resonating.

Anyway, all that's to say that I'm glad that I get to encounter Christ with you and in you, to witness you encountering Him face to face. He loves you, He delights in you, and He is so remarkably glad to be a part of your story. God bless you,
