

From the Pastor

Hello friends.

I'm writing this article on Thursday – my second to last day at FOCUS' New Staff Training ("NST," but you don't have to remember that). FOCUS (the Fellowship of Catholic University Students) is a big part of my own history – after graduating from St. Mary's in Winona I went down to Champaign IL for my first NST (they've since outgrown that space), then up to Duluth for three years as a college missionary. That time was formative for me - it's where I felt the call again to be a priest (fun fact, I went to seminary my first two years of college before switching out), and it's where some of my evangelistic and ministerial tendencies really took root. Being back in this ecosystem for a few weeks (much like the Holy Land pilgrimage I was chaplain for this time last year) has been rejuvenating and grounding. Especially as we navigate things in our parishes like a sanctuary remodel in Viroqua, following a new Bishop's lead, and the steady and beautiful work of integrating new families and parishioners into our established communities, it was important for me to take this deep breath and take some stock of the gifts God has given you and me to steward together.

FOCUS brought me down here to Lincoln to serve as a chaplain for a few weeks – that means celebrating daily Mass, hearing confessions, and making myself present to the missionaries between classes and at meals. The biggest time element has been spiritual direction. On a given day I've had an hour with five or six missionaries to listen for the voice of the Holy Spirit moving them, addressing anything from learning how to pray to healing and restoring old places of hurt and unforgiveness to working through family of origin issues to allowing Christ to develop a relationship of intimacy with them. I don't quite want to call it a mistake, but I certainly made the decision not to limit my own availability – this made for some long days, and I am immediately grateful for the good use of the Pastor's time you and I invested in my presence here.

This all brings me to one final reflection. Practically speaking, we are not going to see the fruit of these missionaries' labors in our corner of the Church very soon. But after several decades of withdrawing (or, to put it in tactical terms, "retreating"), the Church is entering a new springtime. We are seeing this in our own parishes, college chaplains like Fr. McCarty are seeing it in their students, and the Diocese is seeing it in the strange interest of young adults to return to the tradition and beating heart of the Church – the Eucharist. It is critically important that we invest ourselves in efforts like FOCUS and NET and the Eucharistic Revival. These last few weeks of my absence have been a real investment on your part, and I need you to know how grateful I am to you and to Frs. Kuhn and McCarty for helping invest my time in this labor for God's kingdom.


What does your future hold?
