



From the Pastor

Hello friends,

Before getting into some commentary, let me first take a minute to thank everybody who helped with and attended last Sunday's Pancake Breakfast and Wednesday's Fall Dinner. These events are both great for a fantastic meal and visibility in the community, but I remain stubbornly convinced that their greatest benefit is bringing us together in service and fellowship – excellent community building. There is a lot that goes into rallying for these moments, and I am deeply grateful to everyone involved!

Now for the commentary. Last weekend I mentioned the tension between global concern and local action. Building on that, I'd now like to get political (which is not at all the same as "partisan"). Take a deep breath, and let's name a few election-related elephants in the room (pun not intended). Elephant One: there are Democrats in our parishes, there are Republicans in our parishes, and there are independent voters in our parishes. I am very glad that we can share the space of liturgical worship and community together. Elephant Two: Jesus Christ founded neither the Republican Party nor the Democratic Party – He founded the Catholic Church. Elephant Three: Jesus was not non-political. The political struggles between Pharisees and Sadducees, Romans and Jews, Jews and Gentiles weave throughout His story, and He doesn't shy away from these struggles.

It is good for you and me to be interested and involved in politics with charity and integrity. The part that I tend to lazily forget is the need to form my mind and conscience to vote well. If you are looking for a tool to help you understand how to vote as a Catholic, allow me to point you to a document the US Bishop's Conference (USCCB) recently updated: "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship." In this document, the Bishops start with the Four Principles of Catholic Social Teaching: the Dignity of the Human Person, Subsidiarity, the Common Good, and Solidarity. From there they develop how Catholic Social Teaching considers some of the specific major issues in today's political landscape by topic: Human Life, Promoting Peace, Marriage and Family Life, Religious Freedom, Economic Justice, Health Care, Immigration, Education, Promoting Justice and Countering Violence, Combatting Unjust Discrimination, Care for Our Common Home, Communications & Media & Culture, and Global Solidarity. 

The good news is that God trusts us enough to let us use the minds and hearts He's given us.
