

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

First thing: a BIG thank you to everyone who helped with the picnic this weekend. When several of our folks brought this up to me as a possibility last year, my immediate reaction was a hushed "nice." Tangible artifacts just like this are remarkably important – in the first place, they bring insiders together and invite outsiders in. In the second place, they indicate the love you have for our community. The fact that this whole thing is parishioner-generated is an example of the type of initiative that really makes us tick. It takes a village to make Saturday happen, and I am deeply grateful for the energy, time, and talent you invested in our Parish. I take credit only for putting my stamp of approval on it and for generating dunk tank revenue.

Second thing: A few weeks ago, I mentioned two new staff positions up in Viroqua – a Coordinator of Ongoing Formation (Pat Obernberger) and a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Director (Carly Zadow). Both of these positions serve Viroqua primarily with heavy coordination with Coon Valley. Carly spent the last week and a half up in La Crosse for an intensive training program, and I'd like to share some of her reflections with you here:

Hello! I know many of you, but in case we have yet to be introduced, my name is Carly Zadow. My husband Ben and I sit in the middle-ish left pews in Viroqua, mostly on Sundays. He has a reddish beard, and I perpetually have a bow in my hair.

As Father announced a couple of weeks ago, we are starting Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, a Montessoribased method of faith formation for kids under twelve. I just finished a training to learn how to begin this program with our 3-6 year olds here. Let me give you some background on how I got involved in this program.

When I was studying Early Childhood Education in college, I always felt very drawn to the Montessori method. When I began RCIA a few years later, I wondered if there was a way to integrate Montessori with faith formation. This idea was set aside for the next several years until Alex and Father Joe approached me with the idea of starting CGS. After doing some research, I realized that this program was exactly what I had in mind during RCIA, so I decided to accept this position and attend the training, and I am endlessly grateful that I did.

The training was intensive, but also spiritually nourishing, like a retreat. The main "theme" for me was that the child ought to be treated as an individual who is fully capable of having a deeply personal relationship with Jesus Christ. It is the adult's primary job to guide the child with the mindset of the lowly servant, being an instrument rather than an "instructor" in the traditional sense. I was bewildered at what our trainer shared about the profound relationships that some of her students had cultivated with Christ through CGS, and I look forward to stewarding this kind of relationship between Jesus and his little ones here in our parish. I want to thank all of you who have been so supportive of me pursuing this, and I can't wait to see what this program does for our parishes.
