

#### DID YOU KNOW?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$100,000 a year from your IRA directly to a charity. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD. ## From the Pastor

#### Hello friends,

We are shifting into a new liturgical season in just a few days, with Lent starting up on Ash Wednesday. First, some scheduling business – on Ash Wednesday we're changing our daily Mass schedule (one day only), with a 7:00 AM Communion Service and 12:10 Mass in Viroqua and a 5:15 Mass in Coon Valley. This is not a holy day of obligation, but the high attendance at services across the Church indicates the power of this day to start off Lent. Starting next week, we'll have further schedule adjustments on Tuesday and Wednesday, with Stations of the Cross being prayed at 5:15 and Mass shortly after Stations are concluded. On Tuesdays through Lent let's keep that 4:30 adoration time in Coon Valley, and on Wednesdays we'll have some time for adoration after Mass is concluded too.

Okay, check mark for scheduling. I've mentioned before that I've always enjoyed both Advent and Lent – these two seasons of personal preparation and heart-work to get ready for our two biggest Moments. Advent tries to interrupt the busyness (and frankly commercialism) of the "holiday season" with a note of some somberness, withdrawal and retreat before the powerful lighting-up-theworld at Christ's birth. Lent has a similar tone, preparing us not so much for Easter (the Resurrection) as for the entire Easter Triduum - the movement from the Last Supper (Holy Thursday) through Jesus' arrest to His death (Good Friday), and finally to His Resurrection (the Easter Vigil). It's no coincidence that both the high Mass at Christmas (Midnight) and the main Mass at Easter (the Vigil) share this imagery of light growing and piercing through the physical darkness of night - it shows what Jesus is always doing in you and me, every single day. Anyhow, Catholics are serious about that difference, that we're not putting the cart before the horse by jumping right to the Resurrection Moment, but rather taking in the full movement from Last Supper to Death to Resurrection. Story is important.

As far as our part in Lent goes, the Church has traditionally recommended three main (and effective) ways to prepare – in prayer, in fasting, and in almsgiving. Take some time over the next few days before Ash Wednesday comes along to ask some simple questions about these three categories. Practical action plans are important here. For prayer, "Jesus, how are you trying to draw me deeper into relationship with you?" For fasting, either (A) "what is getting in the way of my relationship with you that you're asking me to let go of?" or (B, if there's nothing needing cleaning up there), "what good thing are you asking me to let go of so I can learn to rely on you more?" For almsgiving, "how are you asking me to give to the point of discomfort to help those who need my help?" Of course this can be financial, but I also find extra time and effort to be personally fruitful. All simple things to pray with, and I pray for your beautiful and restorative Lent!



## Enrollment Open at St. Charles School in Genoa


