

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

I have two things for you this weekend. First, a quick recap – last weekend Deacon Tony shared a helpful meditation on the Holy Family and what it means to honor family members, especially when honoring family members is tough. We're blessed to have in Deacon Tony both a man of the cloth and also an accomplished therapist, and I thought he blended the Word and tangible practice very well. Let me name those five practical points again for your continuing digestion:

- 1. Separate the person from their actions honoring is not excusing bad behavior but honoring their roles in our lives and treating them with dignity.
- 2. Set healthy boundaries and limits boundaries aren't about cutting someone out but about protecting your own and their own emotional wellbeing.
- 3. *Practice forgiveness* this isn't excusing the other person but choosing not to hold onto resentment. When we forgive, we reflect God's mercy, which is always greater than our hurt. Remember forgiveness is a process, and God walks us through it.
- 4. *Pray for your parents* Ask God to bless them, heal their hearts, and guide their actions. Give Him permission to transform your relationship.
- 5. Focus on your own actions we are ultimately responsible for our own response, regardless of what or who we're dealing with.

Second, this weekend we're celebrating the feast of the Epiphany. In some Christian churches (especially the Orthodox and Eastern Catholics), the Epiphany bears as much weight as Christmas - it's the moment when Christ starts to be revealed not just to the Holy Family and the shepherds, but to the whole world. Here come these three very non-Jewish scholars/philosophers/royals from the East following a supernatural breakthrough into the natural order (that is, the star) to the true Light they've been looking for. The mission of the Magi is first to find Christ, but even more than that to reveal Christ to the world. They are, in a real sense, some of the first spreaders of the Gospel, some of the first evangelists. We have a deep tradition of marking the top of the main door or multiple doors in your house with the date and the letters C, M, B for the names of the Three Magi - Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar. If you would like to take part in this door marking, we've got some blessed chalk ready to go in the back of our churches. Just take a piece home and mark at the top of the doors "20 + C+ M + B + 25" – it's a good way to inaugurate the new year and a good way to remind yourself whenever you look up

and see those letters that there's something different about a home marked by Christ's birth, revelation, death and resurrection.


Central WI Retrouvaille \Retro- vī\Marriage Help Program
