

#### From the Pastor

Hello friends,

At the risk of redundancy, the apocalyptic flavor of the readings over the last few weeks has a point. Our liturgical year starts over next weekend with the last month of Mary's pregnancy before Jesus' birth on Christmas, so these last few weeks are meant to feel climactic, like the end of a journey. Right now we're supposed to be taking a deep breath and recalling everything that's happened since December 3 last year – making the time to remember what Advent looked like and how it led into Christmas, what it felt like to take a deep breath with that blip of Ordinary Time before Ash Wednesday, how Lent led into the Triduum and how Easter played out after, how grace opened up in the slow and steady work of Ordinary Time again.

Memory is important. Taking the time and putting in the work to reflect, recall, and receive is what lets a memory become meaningful – what invites grace to grow and expand past the point of first reception. You've heard me talk about C.S. Lewis enough to know I'm a big fan, but chances are you haven't read my favorite work by him, the (in my opinion) unfortunately named "Space Trilogy" – it's a less read work of his, something like the adult Chronicles of Narnia. There's a line in the first book when the protagonist Ransom is reflecting on the memory of a pleasure with his Martian guide (it's not as weird as it sounds), and his guide shares with him:

"A pleasure is full grown only when it is remembered. You are speaking, Hman, as if the pleasure were one thing and the memory another. It is all one thing. The Seroni could say it better than I say it now. Not better than I could say it in a poem. What you call remembering is the last part of pleasure, as the crah is the last part of a poem. When you and I met, the meeting was over very shortly, it was nothing. Now it is growing something as we remember it. But still we know very little about it. What it will be when I remember it as I lie down to die, what it makes in me all my days till then—that is the real meeting. The other is only the beginning of it."

So much for memory. From time to time I encourage you to make of this or that place in your life and heart an invitation to the Lord – to let Him guide and lead and open up whatever grace He has in store for you. With this last week of Adventprep, take some time to invite Him to open up what He's done in you, how He's tried to move despite your best efforts, and how He's trying to show you more clearly by what He's done who He is and who you are.




