





From the Pastor

Hello friends.

You may have heard me throwing out the terms "Pastoral Council" and "Finance Council" and thought to yourself, "Just look confident, don't let anyone know you don't know what that is." The Finance Council is a team of parishioners well suited to look at, understand, and help the Pastor understand the movement of the Parish's income and expenses. They're concerned with the dollars and cents of the parish. The Pastoral Council is all about the culture of the parish – liturgy, formation, programming needs, etc. They're about helping the Pastor see the needs of his people and extending his vision and mission to the parishioners. A critical element is the way both Councils provide important continuity between Pastors.

Anyway, just a few days ago the Pastoral Councils from both our parishes got together for a potluck and meeting down in Coon Valley. Both of these councils have been invaluable to me over the last few years, but there's always been the hiccup that a member of one parish's council has no official communication about what's going on in the other parish's council (past the fact that we have Humfelds on each). This meeting was all about building a bridge and giving the councilors in each group a chance to know the other.

If by "business" we mean scheduling events or starting up new programming, we didn't get much "business" done on Thursday. We didn't even get through the full set of three questions I had them consider beforehand (what unifies our parishes, what makes my parish distinct, and what challenges will we face working together?). Before anything we introduced ourselves - who am I, how long have I actively involved myself in the parish, and what particularly interests me about our parish life? Common themes included community building, faith formation, and liturgical ministry. Once we finally tucked into the questions we saw even more commonality come out – love for the feel and aesthetic of each parish, the variety of ages at our liturgies and the crossover of parishioners from one parish to the other, collaborating and participating in picnics and Passion Plays, pooling resources for Religious Education and adult formation, the list goes on. We saw common concerns - the need to welcome and open ourselves up to outsiders exploring our established communities (that is to say, "hello, I'm Scott, are you new to St. Mary's?"), the need to develop/build up Men's Clubs in the parishes, getting kids involved in things like serving and community events. As for the third question, we had already blown past the hour and a half I had asked of the councils, so we tabled it until our next combined meeting in half a year. I am grateful for the evening, both to hear points of pride and concerns and common desires and also (more importantly even) for the moment of shared community. Please continue to pray for all our work, and thank you again for welcoming me here as your Pastor!


