

From the Pastor

Hello friends,

We've got a few pieces of out-of-the-ordinary business coming up, so allow me to break it down for you a bit.

First, some good news - we are on for another

seminarian this summer! You may remember John Francis from last summer – throughout June and July (and a bit of May and August) John stayed with me up in Viroqua last year. During his time, he got a Bible Study rolling (which is still going to this day), worked with our servers and tended the Coon Valley cemetery, visited our homebound and resident parishioners, and got to know many of you over fires, suppers, and cowhide processing. This summer Matthew Szymanski (soon to be Deacon Matthew Szymanski, on June 1) will be joining us for a similar experience. What does "soon-to-be-Deacon" mean? Great question. One year before priesthood ordination, seminarians are ordained deacons (just like Deacon Tony, but with a different trajectory). This will also add in a few more opportunities for Matthew, especially when it comes to preaching. I hope to get another Bible Study together for him, as well as a few other projects. In the meantime, allow me to encourage you to reach out to him early to have him over for dinner and get to know him. His schedule will follow our daily Mass schedule pretty closely, and as we all saw last summer with John there's a lot to be said for getting into his social calendar earlier than later. More to come, keep your eyes peeled.

Second, I will be heading out of town focus after next week's Bishop installation from May 20-31 to chaplain FOCUS'

New Staff Training down in Lincoln. This is when FOCUS gets all their new missionaries together for a few weeks to get them ready to go out on campus (near us, they're in Platteville, Madison, Winona, and La Crosse), and while I'm down there I'll be helping with sacraments, spiritual direction, and whatever else the team might throw at me. I've mentioned my own time as a missionary (which, importantly, set me on a trajectory toward priesthood and heavily informs my own methodology), and I am looking forward to this chance to give back to an institution that's given quite a bit to me. This will mean we will be without daily Mass during that window, but Fr. Nate Kuhn (an absolute bear of a man and our diocese's Vocations Director) will be here to celebrate the weekend's Masses. Pray for the new missionaries that are getting ready for the next year's labors in the vineyard!

Adventure Camp:



Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. The La Crosse Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, in partnership with the Order of Malta, is pleased to announce the launching of a new program to provide an opportunity to be involved in prison ministry right from the comfort and safety of your own homes.



Friends Through Pens is a pen pal mentoring program sponsored by the Order of Malta. As a volunteer, you would commit to anonymous monthly written correspondence to an inmate who has already been screened by the program. These inmates often feel alone and forgotten, and your inspiring words of comfort fill them with hope. Incarcerated participants have agreed not to request special favors from you (financial assistance, romantic involvement, personal contact) and all correspondence is exchanged directly through the Order of Malta headquarters to ensure your safety and privacy. Your personal letter is a work of mercy, expressing compassion, understanding and guidance to rebuild inmates' self-esteem. As a prison pen pal mentor, you are participating in the valuable act of restorative justice,

because studies have proven that pen pal mentoring decreases the rate of recidivism and helps to positively form the character of those who will be returning to society. Program instructions and sample letters are all provided in the Pen Pal Mentoring Guidance Package once you agree to volunteer in the program. For more information, please contact Lorraine
