

From the Pastor

Hello friends, and Merry Christmas!

Over the next few weeks we've got a few temporary schedule adjustments. This week I'll be heading out to Salt Lake City with some parishioners for FOCUS' SEEK conference. Some personal history to catch you up before seminary I was a FOCUS missionary, working primarily at the University of Minnesota Duluth with college students, leading Bible studies, coaching and mentoring, praying with them, and working together on a relationship with Christ. I'm a big fan of the work FOCUS does, including this conference, and I've intentionally remained involved with them in some staff formation and spiritual direction. The SEEK conference (along with FOCUS' 9-5 work) is directed primarily at college students, with a growing side hustle in parish ministry, and over the next week here I hope this group's experience will help us see if such missionary work might help serve our parishes well too. Pray for our safe travels, for our openness to the Holy Spirit, and for the literal tens of thousands of Catholic young adults, parishioners, priests and religious who will be gathering in Salt Lake City and Washington, DC.

Anyway, back to local business. Since I'll be out of office from December 31(my dad's and Linda Schulte's birthday)-January 7, we've got a few Mass adjustments. First, January 1 is the *Solemnity of Mary Mother of God*, also a Holy Day of Obligation. This Tuesday Fr. Parr (a Viroqua local) will celebrate a vigil Mass in Coon Valley at 5:15, and on Wednesday he'll celebrate 12:10 and 5:15 Masses in Viroqua. There will be no daily Mass on January 2 or 3, but the weekend will be business as usual. Finally, there will not be daily Mass on January 7, but on January 8 I'll be back in the saddle for our routine schedule.

Over the course of Advent we set about the ambitious project of adoration every single day of the week. It was ambitious, and I was very happy with it. Three things. First, it is no longer Advent, so that extraordinary schedule no longer stands. Second, January 8 onward we'll return to our customary adoration times from 4:30-5:00 on Tuesdays in Coon Valley and 5:45-6:30 on Wednesdays in Viroqua. If you got something out of coming to one of those Advent adoration times (or, for that matter, if some other practice you took on was a Help), please be free to explore adding it into your regular schedule too. Third, and finally, if you have any feedback on adoration times (such as "hey, that noon time was really helpful"), let me know. I can't guarantee it'll necessarily lead to a shift, but in my efforts to find what works best with y'all's (technical term) schedule that will be helpful information.

Alright. God bless you, and I'll see you soon!
