





From the Pastor

Hello friends,

Back when Dcn. Matthew started with us in May or June or so, he commented something like "y'all are gonna see a lot of seminarians come through here" (I remember him having a Southern accent, and I refuse to change that memory). I've been very grateful for the chance to have several of these guys come through St. Mary's and St. Mary's – John last summer, Noah through the school year, Dcn. Matthew this summer – and I owe a lot of it to a happy convergence of proximity to La Crosse, a fair demographic representation of the Diocese broadly, and the different programming and opportunities our parishes have going on. Still, when Dcn. Matthew made that comment I flinched a little for the possibility of misleading all of you – we have a decent number of guys in seminary, but they certainly don't make up a limitless pool. Anyway, I was wrong. This weekend we're introducing our Journey Seminarian for the year - Joey Uhlir.

Let's back up a bit. If you're unfamiliar with the term, a "seminarian" is someone considering becoming a priest and studying priest things. It entails college studies, usually in philosophy, then typically four years of grad school in theology. Sometimes guys tack on extra studies (like my fraternity brother Fr. Ethan in Tomah, who just finished up a year in Rome studying liturgy), sometimes not. When a man enters seminary he is very much not signing on the dotted line – that doesn't entirely happen until the moment very late in the game when he's ordained a deacon. While a seminarian is in college and grad school he's also given opportunities (like John Francis spending the summer with us – Dcn. Matthew's discernment is concluded) to encounter the life he's considering and build up his data pool, so to speak. This earnest discernment is a major part of a seminarian's time in formation: learning what the priesthood is and what a priest's ministry looks like so that he can most clearly ask the question "is this where God is asking me to invest my life?"

Back to Joey. Just like with Noah last academic year, Joey is starting off his time in seminary with the Journey Program, a year-long exploration of spirituality, formation, and study up at the Diocese under Fr. Nate Kuhn. Once a month he (and the other Journey guys at other parishes) will join us for a weekend's Masses and programming, so you'll see him around for a bit here. Please introduce yourself, and if you would like to get to know him a bit more allow me to recommend reaching out to him or myself with a dinner or lunch offer after Masses.

These workshops will address Catholic beliefs, treatment options and assist you in creating or updating your own Advance Care Plan.


