

#### From the Pastor

Hello friends.

Several of our parishioners were at the Confirmation Mass on Thursday night – St. Mary's in Richland Center, Sacred Heart in Lone Rock, and our own two parishes brought together 21 High Schoolers in Viroqua for the shared celebration. Bishop Callahan also presided at the Mass, and boy was he ready to go. For some context, a month or two ago Pope Francis accepted Bishop Callahan's graceful resignation and appointed Bishop Gerard Battersby the next bishop for our diocese, with an installation on May 20. That means that our Confirmation is one of Bishop Callahan's last, and throughout the Mass I kept thinking "he's in full victory lap mode." It was a beautiful liturgy, and Bishop Callahan made a clear point of calling the confirmandi to step into their faith with conviction, decision, and tangible acceptance of the Fruits of the Holy Spirit.

One of the several moments that struck me was when he had the candidates stand in front of him, gazed penetratingly into each of their eyes, and told them they were being introduced to a Successor of the Apostles. I've seen Bishop Callahan invoke his authority before (he made me a deacon and priest), but there was something stirring in this moment, seeing him draw that clear line from himself to the guy who ordained him to the guy who ordained him to the...all the way back to St. Andrew or James or Peter. This is it folks. Maybe you've heard people say one religion or branch of Christianity is the same as any other, maybe you've even bought into that yourself, but the truth is that that's more a cheapening simplification than it is the truth. When we're looking at what sets Catholics apart, it's the Sacraments and that Apostolic Succession Bishop Callahan was talking about - it's being rooted in the Church Jesus Christ established. We're not at war with our brothers and sisters, we're working for the reconciliation and restoration of Christ's Body on Earth. But we also need to know we're not all the same.

Please take some time over the next few weeks to pray earnestly for Bishop Callahan and Bishop Battersby. I will always be deeply grateful to Bishop Callahan for accepting me into seminary, for leading me through formation and ordination, and for shepherding me as I shepherd you. He has poured himself out for the last fourteen years as our Bishop, and now it's time for him to receive a well-earned rest and hand on the mantle. As for Bishop Battersby, we'll be seeing him around over the coming years too, and if you're curious about our new shepherd I encourage you to look up "Bishop Battersby's Vocation Story" on Youtube or your preferred podcast platform. I'll echo his introduction to the clergy and curia: "I don't come to you as the best bishop you could receive. If you want the best bishop you can receive, then you're gonna have to fast and pray for me, that the Holy Spirit might make me the one that you need. The one that he has in store and planned for you. And so, I ask you to pray for me, and to love me and receive me, and to allow me to bring Jesus to you in the way that the Holy Spirit has gifted me these many years of priesthood."
